About the College

To introduce higher education and bolstering job opportunities among the disadvantaged, marginalized and weaker sections of society in the remotest Dhalai District, Government Degree College, Kamalpur, was established in 1987, directly patronised by the Government of Tripura. Since then, this college has been able to establish its name as the premier centre of higher education in this district as well as in the state. The college started with a meagre number of students and a still lesser number of teachers, now boasts of having around twenty-four hundred students and a sprawling campus area of 36.1 acres overlooking the flowing Dhalai river and the green Longtharai range.

Affiliation & Accreditation

Government Degree College, Kamalpur is affiliated to Tripura University (A Central University) as an undergraduate General Degree College. The UGC recognized this college under 2f & 12B category. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council has accredited the college with Grade B in 2017.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION TO
FIRST SEMESTER UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME IN
GENERAL DEGREE COLLEGES OF TRIPURA DURING ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26**

A. Eligibility:

- i. A student who has passed Higher Secondary/H.S.(+2 stage)/Senior Secondary examination or equivalent from any recognized Board/Council shall be eligible for admission to the 1st Semester of Undergraduate (B.A./B.Sc) programme, subject to availability of seats. The students shall be taken into consideration for admission if he/she applied within five years from year of passing. The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.
- ii. **For B.Sc. (Physical Science):** A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with pass marks in Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics shall be eligible for admission.
- iii. **For B.Sc. (Biological Science):** A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with pass marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be eligible for admission.
- iv. **For B.A. Programme:** A candidate who has passed 10+2 in any stream shall be eligible to take admission.
- v. A student may be allowed to change a subject(s)/ stream within **15 days** from his/her admission to the College depending on the availability of seats. No such change shall be entertained once application for University from the College is confirmed.

B. Selection Procedure:

- i. Major, Minor & Interdisciplinary subjects should not be same.
- ii. A student can apply for maximum two subjects as Major in a particular college. Major subject will be allotted strictly based on merit.
- iii. Major & Minor subject cannot be both language subjects.
- iv. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of sum of marks of Best Five subjects of H.S.(+2) Exam and the subject opted for Major.
 - a) If there is a tie in the sum, preference will be given on the marks obtained in the subject opted as Major (for breaking the tie).
 - b) If marks of the subject opted as Major is also equal, then the date of birth of the candidate will be considered. Senior will be given chance.
- v. The merit list will be published for Major subject only.
- vi. Minor and Interdisciplinary subject will be distributed among the students subject to availability of seat.
- vii. Reservation policy of Government of Tripura will be followed.

C. Admission Restriction:

- i. If a candidate takes admission in any college, he/she cannot take admission in any other college. In case of admission in a second college, the admission in first college must be surrendered.

The waiver of all kinds of fees as mentioned above except the fees of Affiliating Universities including Registration fee for the Girl students enrolled in such college/institution will continue to prevail as notified vide No.F.2(375)-DHE/UDCA/2005/2377(26) dated 22nd August 2022.

❖ ABOUT THE 4-YEAR DEGREE PROGRAMME UNDER NEP-2020

Duration of the Programme

- a. The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided he/she secures the prescribed number of credits (as given in **Annexure-1**). Students who exit with a UG Certificate or UG Diploma are permitted to re-enter the programme within three years of exit and complete the degree programme.
- b. Students may be permitted to take a break(s) from the study, but the total duration for completing the Programme must not exceed seven years.

Change of College/University Transfer

I. Conditions for transfer of admission of students within the University:

- 1) His/ her transfer admission shall be within the permitted intake of the college.
- 2) Candidate shall be permitted for change of college only for the odd semesters with the due consent from both the colleges and with the permission from the Tripura University subject to availability of same combination of subjects studied in the previous College.
- 3) He/she shall fulfil the attendance requirements as prescribed in this Regulation.
- 4) He/she shall complete the programme as per the Regulations governing the maximum duration of the programme.

II. Conditions for transfer of admission of students of other Universities:

- 1) A candidate migrating from any other University may be permitted to join odd semester of the degree programme provided he/she has passed all the subjects of previous semesters/years as the case maybe. Such candidates must satisfy all other conditions of eligibility stipulated in the Regulations of the University.
- 2) His/her transfer admission shall be within the intake permitted to the college.
- 3) He/she shall fulfil the attendance requirements as per University Regulations.
- 4) The candidate migrating from other University is eligible for overall SGPA/ CGPA of Class and not for ranking.
- 5) He/she shall complete the programme as per Regulations governing the maximum duration of completing the programme as per these Regulations.

Multiple Entry and Exit Option

The student will have opportunity for 'multiple entry and exit' with appropriate certification viz. Undergraduate Certificate after completion of one year (two semesters). Undergraduate Diploma after completion of two years (four semesters), Bachelors' Degree after completion of three years (six semesters) and Bachelors' Degree with Honours/Research after completion of four years (eight semesters).

A student will be allowed to enter/re-enter only at the odd semester and can exit only after the Even Semester. Re-entry at various levels as Lateral Entrants in academic programme shall be based on the Credit Earned and Proficiency Test records.

Awarding of Certificate, Diploma and Degree

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-

enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 122 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in **Table-1**.

4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 162 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in **Table-1**.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 7.5 CGPA and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 162 credits, including 12 credits from a research project / dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

Examination and Evaluation

Continuous Formative Evaluation/Internal Assessment (IA):

Total marks for each course shall be based on continuous assessments and semester-end examinations.

Total marks for each course = 100% Continuous assessment (C1+ C2) = 40% marks

Semester End Examination (C3) = 60% marks

The evaluation process of IA marks shall be as follows

The outline for continuous assessment activities for Component-I (C1) and Component-II (C2) of a course shall be as under.

Conduct of Seminar, Case study, Assignment, etc. can be either in C1 or in C2 component at the convenience of the concerned teacher.

Tests / Seminars / Case studies, *etc.* shall be conducted by the concerned teachers. The students will be informed about the modalities well in advance. The evaluated courses/assignments during component I (C1) and component II (C2) of the assessment will be immediately provided to the candidates after obtaining acknowledgement in the register by the concerned teacher(s) and maintained by the Department.

5% marks for attendance shall be distributed as follows:

75% to less than 80% attendance	– 1 mark
80% to less than 85% attendance	– 2 marks
85% to less than 90% attendance	– 3 marks
90% to less than 95% attendance	– 4 marks
95% and above attendance	– 5 marks

General Provisions:

- A student may also be allowed to sit for any Semester Examination as a Non-Collegiate candidate, if he/she has attended a minimum 65% of classes held in Theory and Practical separately in each Semester and on deposits of requisite amount of fees determined by the University from time to time.
- A student having attendance below 65% (65% Theoretical & 65% Practical classes) of the classes held in any Semester shall be declared as Dis-Collegiate and he/ she shall not be allowed to appear at the Semester-I/ Semester-II/ Semester-III/ Semester-IV/ Semester-V/ Semester-VI and Semester-VII/ Semester-VIII Examinations and shall have to be readmitted.
- No student will be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination of the University if he/ she fails to secure a minimum 40% marks in the Internal Assessment portion.
- The students shall be informed in advance about the schedule of Internal Assessment.
- A candidate having practical paper shall have to submit compulsorily the Practical Note Books (signed by the concerned Teacher) at the time of examination. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the Practical Examinations if he/ she fail to produce Laboratory/ Practical Note Book duly signed by the subject teachers of the concerned College.
- The candidate shall be awarded a Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree when he/ she successfully earns the minimum required credits for the Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree.
- A Grade Card shall be issued to all the candidates after every semester based on the Grade earned. The course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of every semester and CGPA earned till that Academic Year will be displayed in the Grade card.

Letter Grades and Grade Points:

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades as a measure of the student's performance in a given semester. The SGPA is based on the grades of the current term, while the Cumulative GPA (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study.

The College/ Institution may also mention marks obtained in each course and a weighted average of marks based on marks obtained in all the semesters taken together for the benefit of students.

Computation of SGPA and CGPA:

The UGC recommends the following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

- The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses taken by a student, i.e.

$$\text{SGPA (Si)} = \Sigma(\text{Ci} \times \text{Gi}) / \Sigma \text{Ci}$$

where Ci is the number of credits of the i-th course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the i-th course.

- The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \Sigma(\text{Ci} \times \text{Si}) / \Sigma \text{Ci}$$

where Si is the SGPA of the i-th semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.

Accumulation of Credits:

Every student shall open an account in Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), which will provide him/ her with an ABC ID and will allow access to the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). The Credit awarded to a student for the courses pursued in the University shall be accumulated in the Academic Bank Account of the student. The procedure for accumulation of credit earned, redemption of credits would be as per UGC and other relevant Regulations.
